2. REPORT BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TOWN COUNCIL

The Chairman of the Town Council welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Chairman's Report:

The Town Council continues to maintain open spaces and repair/replace public benches and litterbins. This year the Town Council has installed seven new public seats and a new salt bin. Two seats have been donated by members of the public, one on the Humber bank and one at the Wolds and Riverbank Countryside Society's new meadow on Brantingham Road.

The Town Council has also purchased two defibrillators, one for the Methodist Church in Brough and one for the EYMS bus station in Elloughton. Elloughton Road play area is undergoing further refurbishment including the installation of additional equipment for the younger age group. New lighting and improvements to the CCTV system in the Village Hall area has proved very effective in the prevention of vandalism.

The Council's Art Exhibition continues to be a well-respected exhibition within the East Riding and our Christmas Tree Festival is very well attended and enjoyed by everyone.

Brough in Bloom continues to do excellent work within Elloughton and Brough as does the newly established litter picking group. We have many organisations for children and young people run by volunteers. The Cubs, Scouts, Brownies, Guides and Youth Club all need more adult volunteers to enable them to keep running.

The Chairman also reported on progress made by the Petuarua Community Forum, the continuing success of the Humber Enterprise Zone, the imminent closure of South Hunsley swimming pool and the ERYC Local Plan.
